Module Components as Part of a Foundation Course for Master Programmes

Applicants whose relevant skills / knowledge is not sufficient (e.g. with less than 210 credits or lacking specialisation) may yet be granted a conditional admission provided they can obtain the skills / knowledge they lack during their studies or as part of a foundation course. This can be achieved by enrolling for mandatory or elective module components of other study programmes.

Module components forming part of the foundation course have to be submitted to the examination office on the „Antrag auf Anrechnung“ (application for credit) form. They also have to be noted in the table below (cf. § 13 im Allgemeinen Teil der SPO für Masterstudiengänge (general study and examination regulations for master programmes). Additionally, if you wish to take mandatory components ahead of time, this has to be approved by the dean of studies. For both of these, this completed form serves as application form.
